A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF VALPARAISO, FLORIDA ADOPTING THE FINAL LEVYING OF AD VALOREM TAXES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS,	The Mayor and City Commission of the City of Valparaiso adopt the following resolution for the purpose of levying a tentative millage rate upon the tax assessment roll of the year 2023.
	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY ON, AS FOLLOWS:
SECTION I:	There is hereby levied upon the assessment roll of the year 2023, ad valorem taxes for the fiscal year beginning on the 1st day of October 2023, at the rate of 5.024 per \$1000 valuation. The tentative adopted millage rate is greater than the rolled-back rate of 4.6800 by 7.35%.
SECTION II	: This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 721

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF VALPARAISO, FLORIDA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024 COMMENCING 1 OCTOBER 2023; REPEALING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

- WHEREAS, the City Commission and the Valparaiso Cable Authority of the City of Valparaiso, Florida, have held public hearings on September 12, 20223, and September 25, 2023, for the purpose of adopting a final budget for the fiscal year commencing 1 October 2023 and ending 30 September 2024, and, as a result of the input received at these public meetings, has made the final revisions thereto, and
- WHEREAS, the appropriations and revenue estimate for the Budget for the Fiscal Year 2023/24 in the amount of \$11,818,935 and
- WHEREAS, the approval and adoption of this final budget is necessary for the health, welfare, and general benefit of the citizens of the City of Valparaiso, Florida.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF VALPARAISO, FLORIDA:

- Section 1. The final budget for the fiscal year commencing 1 October 2023, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference, is hereby officially adopted.
- Section 2. During FY2024, the Budget can be amended through a resolution passed by a majority vote of the City Commission at a publicized meeting. Such resolution shall detail the amount of the proposed revenue and/or expenditure, the total of which must exceed \$5,000.00, and shall reference the particular fund to which it shall apply. The resolution shall state the purpose of any proposed expenditure and the source of the funds to be used as payment. Such resolution shall also authorize the City Clerk to revise the FY2024 monthly financial statements accordingly.
- Section 3. The appropriations set forth in said budget are hereby approved, adopted, and authorized.
- Section 4. Any ordinance in conflict herewith is repealed to the extent of such conflict.
